EHB Grill

Village Bar

Located behind the University Library. The lunch menu includes a "roast of the day", a range of hot meals, burgers and pizza. Monday - Thursday: 12:00pm - 2:00pm; Friday: 9:30am - 2:00 pm.

ManchuHan Restaurant

Chinese restaurant in the Students' Union. Monday - Friday: 11:30am - 3:00pm and 5:00pm - 8:00pm; Saturday: 12:00pm - 3:30pm and 5:00pm - 8:00pm.

Martin Hall Café

Sir David Davies Café


Similar to the above, but located in the Sir David Davies Building. Monday - Friday: 8:30am - 4:30pm.

Loughborough & its surroundings



Explore Loughborough

Town Centre & Market Place, LE11 3EA

Loughborough town centre has a small pedestrian area as well as a retail market that has been part of the town's history for almost 800 years. It is held every Thursday and Saturday in the Market Place from 8am to 4pm. When there is no market, the town centre offers the usual range of shops, cafés and pubs one can expect in a smaller English town.

Queen's Park, LE11 3BJ

Queen's Park, near the town centre, is a nice green area to wander around. Inside Queen's Park, you can also find the Carillon, a war memorial and well-known landmark, visible from several miles away.

Great Central Railway, LE11 1RW

A heritage railway in Leicestershire, named after the company that originally built this stretch of railway. It runs for 8.25 miles between Loughborough and a new terminus just north of Leicester. It has period signalling, locomotives and rolling stock, and is the only place in the world where full size steam engines can be seen passing each other.

Beacon Hill, LE12 8SP

Rising to a height of 245m, Beacon Hill is one of the highest points in Leicestershire and boasts spectacular views of Charnwood Forest and the Soar Valley. It is within walking distance (around 7km) of Loughborough University, but a round trip will take approx. 3-4 hours. If you enjoy hiking but don't know how to get there, then please speak to the organisers.

Bradgate Park, Newtown Linford, LE6 0HE

Originally a deer park around 800 years ago, it provides 830 acres of publicly accessible countryside. The Park offers a wild and rugged landscape with dramatic rocky outcrops and gnarled old oak trees, many of which are well over 500 years old. The landscape offers some of the finest views, and is rich in change throughout the seasons, with several herds of deer still wandering around the park. It's a short drive out from Loughborough, but well worth the trip.

Nearby Cities & Attractions Nottingham

Nottingham Castle

Located in a commanding position on a natural promontory known as "Castle Rock", with cliffs 130 feet high to the south and west. In the Middle Ages it was a major royal fortress and occasional royal residence.

City Of Caves

City of Caves is a visitor attraction in Nottingham based on a network of caves, carved out of sandstone that have been variously used over the years as a tannery, public house cellars, and as an air raid shelter.

Sherwood Forest

Sherwood Forest is a royal forest, famous by its historic association with the legend of Robin Hood.

Leicester

King Richard III Visitor Centre

Explore the life of King Richard III and how his remains were discovered in 2012 under a car park.

National Space Centre

Offers various exhibitions, including six interactive galleries, the UK's largest planetarium, and a 42m high Rocket Tower.

New Walk Museum And Art Gallery

Opened in 1849, it was one of the first public museums in the United Kingdom. New Walk contains displays of science, history and art, both international and local.

Peak District

Just an hour's drive north of Loughborough you'll find the Peak District National Park. Steep limestone valleys like Dovedale, with its famed stepping stones, and Lathkill Dale characterise the park's southern area, which is known as White Peak. North, the Dark Peak area has dramatic gritstone ridges and stark moorland plateaus like Kinder Scout, the park's highest point.

Chinese, Thai and Japanese cuisine.

Burgers and smokehouse style food, including some vegetarian options.

Browns Lane Restaurant And Bar, LE11 3HE

Contemporary British cuisine, a bit more upmarket, but not posh.

Goodliffe's, LE11 1UE

Contemporary British cuisine, a little less upmarket than Brown's Lane.

Burgers, steaks and the like, plus some vegetarian options.
